ST.MM Be-attitudes Pax Christi group extends an invitation to all parishioners to join in the practice and implementation of our Catholic Social Justice mission of making peace in our time within our personal and family life, parish life, and community life at the local, state, national and international levels.

Peacemaking Basic Training will be led by the Gospel and Spirit inspired Michigan Peace Team on **Sept 20 from 9am – 5 pm in the social hall.**

Goals of Training are:

1. Experience the transforming power of nonviolence for oneself and society;
2. Learn about and practice skills for nonviolent peacemaking;
3. Learn of domestic & international violence reduction peacemaking efforts and opportunities for volunteering on projects; Experience working together with others as a peace team.

The Basic Training is accomplished through telling stories of empowerment from one-on-one conflict situations of small and large peace teams. The Peace Team will also explain the theoretical and spiritual interconnectedness of all humanity and the earth which is the basis of nonviolence. Through the use of theory, stories, music and humor, you will come to understand the roots of violence and practical skills to defuse it for the sake of a more just and peaceful community and society. We are excited to start this year with new ideas and lots of energy!



Home Study: Start-up meeting for parents and youth will be on Sunday, Sept. 14, at 10:15 right after the 9am Liturgy. All those in long-term home study must attend this meeting with Beth Slack (our Lead Catechist for Home Study) to receive all the information and details for home study families. Short-term home study students must attend the first day of class to pick up their materials. In addition, parents need to contact their child's catechist for the information needed for the 6 weeks of home study.

Grade 10 will start classes on Sunday, Sept. 14, at 5:30pm. They will then celebrate the Rite of Enrollment at 11am Mass, on **September 21** followed by class that evening at 5:30.

Family Program will start Sunday, Sept. 21 with classes at 10:30am (no start up meeting). Kindergarten will begin at 9 & 11, and Grade 9 begins at 5:30 in the evening.

Classes will begin Wednesday and Thursday Sept. 24 & 25! (Summer seems to fly by!) Parents of all grades are invited to attend our beginning prayer service during your child's class time to start our year, and then to stop in the classrooms after classes so our catechists can introduce themselves and give you handouts and information for the upcoming year!



We are taking registrations for fall classes in the office from 9 am - 8:30 pm. Many of our classes are filled, so please have two choices ready when you come in to register! Our traditional classes meet Wednesday and Thursday, 4:30-6 or 6:30-8; high school (9th & 10th grade) meet Sunday evening, 5:30-7; (they are invited to stay for youth group from 7-9!), kindergarten has openings Sunday during the 9/11 am Liturgies. Our Family Program has openings and meets two Sundays per month after the 9am Liturgy, and is designed for formation for the whole family at the same time!

Their program ranges from shared prayer, to speakers; from book discussions, to sharing about family; they play, share service projects and offer great support to each other. WHAT INQUIRING MINDS WANT TO KNOW *from Diane Kubus*

This month we will begin again; "FAITH INQUIRY "

It's a time of casual conversation where "inquirers" come seeking information about the Catholic Church. They find out very quickly that Inquiry is very informational but they also find that it is a time to share our stories, answer their questions and we get to know one another.

Typically some of the questions might be: *Why do Catholics pray to saints?* or *Why do you believe that the Pope is infallible and what exactly does infallibility mean?* Sometimes we may look to *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* or other sources to respond to these questions. But Inquiry also asks each individual to look within and discover how God is working in our lives *here and now*, in *this* place, at *this* time. We seek to understand how God is speaking to us in the midst of our concerns, doubts, joys and sorrows. We begin to connect our own stories with God's great Love Story found in our Scriptures. We celebrate those connections in prayer and Liturgy, in mission and service.

Throughout the process, the inquirer is invited to decide where this process will take them. We continue to open ourselves to God and allow God to transform us as we move along a journey of faith; growing in our relationship with God and with each other.

Again, Inquiry is the first phase of the initiation process and is a time of asking questions and exploring the Catholic faith. Any one can begin Inquiry at any time. **Adults** meet on **Mondays from 7 - 8:30pm. beginning September 8** and the **children 7 yrs. and older** meet on the same night (separate from the adults) **from 7 - 8 pm.** If you have ever thought about becoming Catholic, know someone who has and would like to know more, please come join us. The DEACON'S BENCH *from Dave Scharf*

There is a scene in the movie ***Return of the King***, based on J.R.R. Tolkien's saga, *The Lord of the Rings*, in which Aragorn gives the dead soldiers who had deserted their king a chance to regain their honor if they would help to defend the City of Kings which is under attack by evil powers. He enters a cave through a small crevice in the mountain. It is dark and the sound effects make it clear that this is not a pleasant place. He steps over piles of dry bones heaped up against the walls of the cave. Suddenly, in the center of a large room, these skeletal creatures begin to threaten him, even though they are not really alive. Aragorn offers them a chance to redeem themselves by making good on their pledge to defend the good against evil, and to be a part of a community that will restore the kingdom.

We live in a world that is filled with death. We kill each other in acts of murder, abortion, euthanasia, execution, war and terrorist activities. We kill ourselves through suicide, drug and alcohol abuse, smoking, overwork, stress, bad eating habits, and physical neglect. We watch calmly as others die from poverty, hunger and malnutrition, homelessness, unemployment, poor education, disease, child abuse, arms proliferation, discrimination, pollution, and destruction of the environment.

The most important question we need to ask ourselves is; am I ready to face my death? A strange question and its truthful answer are found in the sacred scriptures of the Hindus. "What is the greatest wonder in the world?" The answer is: "All of us know that we will surely die, but each of us foolishly thinks that he or she will not die any time in the near future." Let us not be foolish; let us be wise and well prepared and ever ready to meet our Lord with a clear conscience when the time comes.

Sorry to be so morbid this month, but thinking about the ones we have lost over this summer (and maybe my age) have caused me think about my own mortality and what will God hold me accountable for when I stand before him.

The "Dog Days" of summer are upon us! However, I do not believe that anyone looks at the days in August as I did some sixty three years ago. The changes in our society are happening faster than ever before. But is our society, our parish community, moving in the right direction? Are we still focused on a loving relationship with God? The answers to these questions will be made clear when we stand before Him on Judgment day.
